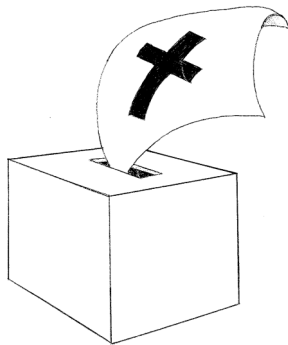

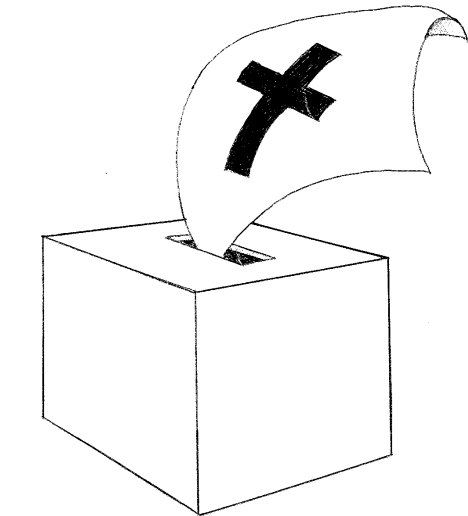

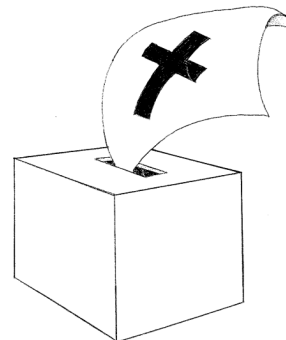
Terry Drummond
